

Equestrian family seeks NANNY (start July 2021)

We are an NHS doctor and lawyer seeking a nanny for our 3-year-old and 4.5-year-old daughters in beautiful **Oddington, Oxfordshire**. Well positioned for rural pursuits and within very easy reach of Oxford and Bicester. The ideal candidate would be a fun-loving, outdoor-loving (and preferably pony-loving) nanny for our two girls. We take a flexible view on qualifications and experience; the only requirement is a clean driving licence.

Day-to-day responsibilities:

- Taking the children to school/pre-school in the local village just one mile down a quiet country lane (so transport can be by any preferred method: pony, bike, car, legs!)
- Collecting the 3-year-old for lunch and putting her down for a nap before collecting the 4.5-year-old from school.
- Taking the children to any after-school activities, helping with their homework, giving them tea and on some evenings putting them to bed.
- We have a cleaner but would expect the children's washing to be done and their rooms to be kept tidy by the nanny.
- Arranging fun daytime activities, picnics, and visits during school holidays.
- Both girls love their pony Mollie, so we hope the nanny could look after her too. There is potential for the nanny to ride and look after our other horse, but this is not essential.

Hours: Monday to Friday from 7am to 7pm, with some week night baby-sitting. I take over upon my return from work, often around 6:15pm. My husband will probably take the children to school two days per week when he works from home.

Accommodation: We are converting a barn into a purpose-built nanny annexe with private kitchen/living area and en-suite bedroom. The nanny will have the opportunity to keep a horse of their own on site.

Salary and Annual Leave: Minimum 25 days plus bank holidays (likely to be 30 days plus bank holidays). Annual salary according to experience and approximately £21-28,000. All food expenses included while at work, accommodation and livery for a horse also included.
